



Pillow Case



class time:
3 hours

Supplies:

44-45" wide cotton or flannel fabric, pre wash
 $\frac{3}{4}$ yard main fabric cut to 27" x width of fabric
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cuff fabric cut to 12" x width of fabric
 $\frac{1}{8}$ band of fabric cut to 2" x width of fabric

Intro and Class Summary

1. Gather Students And Begin In Prayer.

2. Class Summary:

In this class you will be learning about basic sewing notions, getting to know the sewing machine and all its parts, loading the bobbin, how to thread the machine, forward and reverse, stitch length, and straight stitches.

3. Class Goods:

Sewing machine, pins, thread, stiff interfacing (teachers precut and trace cross), muslin fabric

4. Go Over Class Rules/Safety

Always keep your eyes on the needle while you're sewing and don't get your fingers too close.

Iron fabric with caution (teachers do this for younger girls)

Teachers cut all fabric to save on class time

Teachers only use rotary cutters for safety



5. Theme - Read And Discuss Quotes:

The theme of this class is “Straight” stitching.

“The Straight and Narrow Path”

When you sew, you want your stitches to be straight and neat. The black lines on the stitching sheets are for you to practice. The stitching sheet with the cross will help you learn to stitch straight lines.

Think of stitching as a road. You need to get from one point to another and there is only one lane of traffic that will get you there. It would be a dangerous, messy business if you were to drive on the wrong side of the road or weave from one lane to another.

Similarly, God had given us one road to Heaven. Only one. That road is through Jesus. Jesus died on the cross to cleanse us from our sins and it is only when we accept Him as our Savior that we are on the path to Heaven.

Many people in this world believe there are a variety of ways to get into Heaven, but the Bible tells us there is only one.

“Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.”

“And as soon as it went out, every time one of them would come, they’d go out to a certain place, then drop off. I’d just hear the sound of it as it went away.

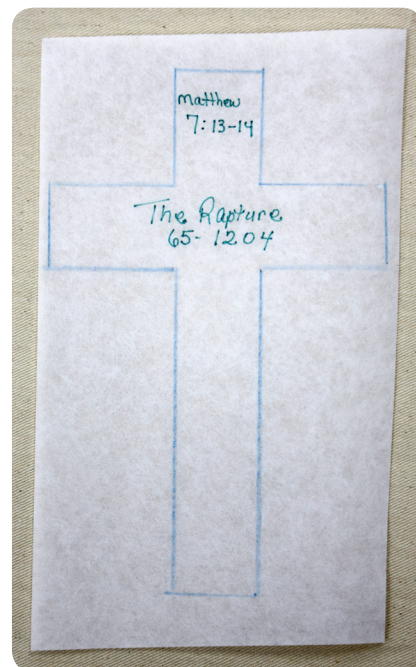

6. Sample Stitching:

Now practice sewing various sample stitchings on muslin. Then take interfacing and stitch a cross by staying in the lines. Once you’re finished, write the scripture & tape date in the cross to possibly to read and listen to during Quiet Time.



Pillow Case Instructions

1. Press all your fabric.
2. Fold your 2" piece in half and press.
3. Lay out your long piece right side up/ 2" piece on top raw edges together. Pin together.
4. Place largest piece on top of first two face down. Add more pins.
5. Align raw seams.
6. Continue to pin (we used LOTS of pins to keep together).
7. Roll your largest piece within a few inches of your pins.
8. Fold your 12" piece over your rolled piece and pin along raw edge, make sure to catch ALL layers (and yes MORE PINS).
9. Stich along raw edge using a 3/8" seam allowance.
10. Remove pins as you sew.
11. Roll the 12" piece back, gently tugging the main piece out of the center.
12. Continue on tugging until the main piece is out.
13. Once it is out it will look like this.
14. Press out both sides tugging gently so it will lie flat.
15. Wrong sides together (yes wrong sides together!).
16. Cut the selvage off.
17. Align the trim and corners of the pillowcase pin in several places.
18. Stitch around raw edges using a 3/8" seam allowance (yes, yes really, right sides out, wrong sides together!).
19. Turn the corner and sew across the bottom.
20. Trim the corner raw edges only please.
21. Press seams opens.
22. Turn the pillowcase wrong side out press the side and bottom seams flat.
23. Stitch using a 1/2" seam allowance. Look you just made French Seams... no raw edges!!!!
24. Turn right side out then press.
25. It looks good outside & in.
