CRAFT CLASS

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CRAFT “The Sword of The King”

AGE: 4-6

ESTIMATED LENGTH: 3 HOURS

NEEDED MATERIALS:

- Sword drills
- Quote printed for sword “The Sword Of The King”
- Cardboard base
- Aluminum Foil
- Gold duct tape
- Silver duct tape
- Pearls
- Pearl paint
- Glue Stick
- Hot Glue Gun - Teachers

INTRO AND CLASS SUMMARY:

1. Gather Students And Begin In Prayer.
2. Read And Discuss Quotes: Moral parable - This sword represents The Bible. This is not to play with as a toy but to remind us this sword is The Bible.

-SCRIPTURES:

1. Students will try to memorize a Scripture before class and bring their Bibles at class.
2. Bible Verse memorization Hebrew 4:12 up to “sword” – prize (sword Bible book marker)

Class Summary:

The class teaches/helpers pre-cut cardboard paper into the shape of a sword & will also wrap sword in aluminum tape for each student before class (see tutorial pics).

-Go over basic guidelines/rules.

-Show examples/samples and demonstrate.

-Let students begin building and decorating their own swords.

Creating Your Own Sword:

1. First, you will need to pre-cut the kids foil to be 25" long.
2. Second have them cut a small section of the foil to cover the point of the sword, and you will hot glue it for them.
3. Thirdly, have the kids glue the edge of the foil down the center of the blade and wrap it around. Once they have it wrapped around you will hot glue the ending edge down for them.
4. Fourth, have them apply 19" of silver duct tape to the protector of their sword. Also have them rip their duct tape into smaller strips in both length and width so it makes it easier for them to apply. (You may have to help them.)
5. Next, they will need 10" of gold duct tape for the guard of their sword. Again, have them rip their duct tape into smaller strips in both length and width so it makes it easier for them to apply.
6. Then, they will paint their handles with the pearl paint, which you will allot to them once they have reached that point. About ¼ ounce.
7. While the paint is drying, you can ask them Bible trivia questions. Once it's dried you will hot glue their pre-cut 27" strand of pearls, at the end of the strand only. Then have them wrap it around their handle. When they reach the end you will hot glue it for them.

8. Finally, the students need to cut around the words THE SWORD OF THE KING and apply them to the blade of their sword with a glue stick.
