# Rustic HAT RACK tutorial

## MATERIALS NEEDED:

**assorted wood**  
**wood glue**  
**acetone**  
**rag or sponge**  
**gloves**  
**finish (ex: mineral oil)**  
**screws**

## TOOLS NEEDED:

**safety glasses**  
**measuring tape**  
**pencil**  
**clamps**  
**sand paper**  
**band saw**  
**miter saw**  
**drill**  
**drill bit (slightly thicker than your pegs)**  
**hammer**  
**box cutter or knife**  
**pin nailer**

## CUT LIST:

**Base: 1 piece 7" wide x 25" long x 7/8" thick**

**Pegs: 4 round pieces of desired length and thickness**


**Wedges: 4 pieces as wide as pegs and 1 1/2" long**  
**(one end thicker than the other)**

**Rack mounting pieces: 2 pieces 1 5/8" wide x 12" long x 11/16" thick**

**Wall mounting piece: 1 piece 4 1/2" wide x 7 1/2" long x 3/4" thick**

\*Parental assistance recommended.






**1.**  
Find and mark the center of the base (12 1/2" in from the sides). Mark 2" up from the bottom, at the center line. This is for the placement of the middle peg.



**2.**  
Measure to the left and right of the center, 8" out and 2" up from the bottom. This is for the placement of the left and right pegs.



**3.**  
Decide on what angle you would like your pegs to slant upward. Drill holes at these marks, at your angle, and slightly thicker than the pegs themselves. You can make a jig to help you keep this angle while drilling.



**4.**  
Cut a 1 1/2" deep slit on one end of each peg.



**5.**  
Slide a wedge into each slit. Do not hammer completely in.



**6.**  
Use a box cutter or knife to shave off the slitted end of the pegs.

7.

Coat the slitted end of the pegs and insert into the holes with wedges perpendicular to the base. Use a block of wood between the hammer and the pegs to protect the pegs. Make sure the peg sticks out the other end.




8.

Hammer the wedges in until snug from the back-side. Make sure the peg stays in place.




9.

Clean up any glue on the front and back. Cut off the back of the peg and wedge, to make it flush with the base.



10.

Rip a 45 degree angle on one long side of the top and bottom rack mounting pieces.




Rip a 45 degree angle on both long sides of the wall mounting pieces.

11.



12.

Glue and pin nail one rack mounting piece to the top back of the base. Make sure the flat long side is flush with the top edge of the base so that the 45 degree angle side is facing down.



13.

Slide the wall mounting piece next to the top rack mounting piece so there is a snug fit. Do not glue this piece in.

14.

Slide the other rack mounting piece next to the wall mounting piece so that the angles fit snug against each other. Place a few pieces of paper between the gap to get the correct spacing.

15.

Glue and pin nail the bottom mounting piece to the rack base.

16.

Slide out the wall mounting piece and wait for the glue to dry.




Sand down the entire project.

Choose a design to apply to the front of your rack. You can use the options in this tutorial or create your own. \*\*The design must be flipped horizontally 180 degrees when printed and on a laser printer.
