CRAFT “Scrap Wreath”

AGE: 10-15

ESTIMATED LENGTH: 3 HOURS

NEEDED MATERIALS:

- Wreath foam (per student)
- Glue guns
- Scissors
- Felt (white, yellow, pastel colors)
- Fabric Strips
- Yarn
- Ribbon (for hanging)
- Lace
- Buttons
- Thread
- Needle
- Pins
- Quote for the wreath

INTRO AND CLASS SUMMARY:

1. Gather Students And Begin In Prayer.

2. Read And Discuss Quotes: Moral parable – The students are using scraps to create their wreath because they are taking even the scraps from the table.
