

Want to take pictures like a pro? Here are some tips:

The way that things are arranged is called composition. When you take a photo, composition is very important. If the things you are taking a picture of are right in the middle of the picture, it sometimes looks boring.

Use the "rule of thirds" to make things a little more interesting. Here is how it works:

The Candy Bar Scene:

In your brain, divide scene into three sections from left to right. It helps to pretend that it's a giant candy bar and you only get to eat one section of it.



Now, put the thing that you are taking a picture of on either side of the candy bar, not in the middle.

Great job, your photos are looking better already!

2 Be a turtle or a falcon:

Try to look at things from a different point of view. Most pictures we see are taken from eye level. To make things more interesting, pretend you are taking pictures from a turtle's view. Or, try to get above things and take a picture from a falcon's eyes. Just be careful!

3 Super Advanced Mode:

If you think you're ready for more advanced photos, try this:

Divide your candy bar (scene) into three more sections, this time from top to bottom. Now you have what looks like a tic-tac-toe board.

Put the main thing at one of the points where your lines cross. It keeps your subject out of the center of the picture, and makes your photo more fun to look at!

Snowflake Tortillas



Here's The Goods:

6 flour tortillas Canola or vegetable oil for baking

Confectioners' sugar Edible glitter, sprinkles, or anything else you want to use for decorating (optional)

Instructions:

Heat the oven to 400 degrees.

Individually fold the tortillas in half once and then in half again, so you end up with a shape that looks like a wedge of pie (it will be thick). They fold easier if they are warmed in the microwave first. Use scissors to cut shapes out of the edges, as if you were making paper snowflakes. When you are happy with your design, unfold the tortillas.

Lightly brush the tops of the snowflakes with oil and place them on a cookie sheet.

Bake at 400 degrees, until lightly browned and crisp (about 4 minutes). Sprinkle confectioners' sugar on the snowflakes while they are still warm. Use glitter and/or sprinkles to decorate them. - ENJOY!

GHOGOLATE DIPPED PRETZELS

WELAYT YOU'LL NEED:

1 (12 oz.) bag chocolate chips
24 pretzel sticks
Sprinkles, nuts, coconut, or anything else to roll the chocolate in



instructions:

Microwave the chocolate until it is melted (The chocolate is smoother if you put the microwave on medium power.) Stir every 30 seconds until the chocolate is completely melted, and smooth. Lick the chocolate off your fingers. (Repeat as needed.)

Dip half a pretzel into the melted chocolate. You may need to reheat the chocolate after a while.

Roll the coated end of the pretzel into your sprinkles (or other decorations.) Stand the pretzels in a glass, chocolate side up, until the chocolate is dry. If you are a boy, sword fight with them until your mommy tells you to stop. If you are a girl, tell your brother (or dad) to cut it out before he makes a mess! Then eat them. Enjoy!





how to Princess Anne Braid

1. Start with a clean straight part down the middle of the head, just as if you were going to make pigtails.

You are going to make French Braids out of both of these sections, starting at the top and working your way down to the neck. When you are done with the first braid, fasten it with a rubber band.

- 2. Once you get to the bottom and both French pigtails are finished, unfasten the first braid and hold the right tail in the right hand and the left tail in the left hand. Your palms should be facing up. Make sure to keep all 6 strands separated between your fingers.
- 3. You want to have both braids ending with the right strand crossing over the middle. Now turn your right hand over so that your palm is facing down and combine these 3 strands with the 3 strands in your left hand, (such as... left strand with right, middle strand with middle, right strand with left)
- 4. Pull these strands tight and finish with a basic braid. Then fasten with elastic.









The Old Testament Book of Ruth tells a great story about three women who lost their husbands and had to decide whether to serve God, or take the easier road. Two of them took the more difficult choice, and served God. It was the harder way, but God honored them and sent a redeemer that would give them a new hope at life.

The story starts with a woman named Naomi, and her husband, Elimelech. They lived in Bethlehem-judah with their two sons, Mahlon and Chilion. A great famine came to the land, and to escape it, the family moved to the land of Moab. While in Moab. Elimelech died. Naomi was left with her two sons and their Moabite wives, Ruth and Orpah.

Then trouble struck the family again, and both of Naomi's sons died too. It must have been devastating for Naomi. All she had left were Ruth and Orpah, the wives of her two sons

One day, while she was looking for food, the owner of the fields, a man named Boaz, noticed her and asked who she was. Boaz was actually related to Naomi's husband who had died years earlier.

Soon, Boaz was paying special attention to Ruth, and giving her special treatment. He made sure that she and Naomi had plenty to eat, and he told all the other men not to touch her. It became clear that Boaz was interested in this girl from Moab.

There were many complicated Jewish laws and customs at that time, but one very important law was that if a woman's husband died, it would take a relative (or kinsman) of her husband to marry her, and give her a chance for a good life with many children. Boaz was a kinsman: he had the ability to redeem Ruth!

Naomi recognized what was going on, and she gave instructions to Ruth on what to do. Ruth followed her instructions perfectly, and soon Ruth and Boaz were married! God had provided Ruth with a redeemer that would give her a second chance at life!

It wasn't long before Boaz and Ruth had a son whom they named Obed. Obed later had a son named Jesse, who grew up and had a very famous son who you have definitely heard of before: David, the same David who killed a giant with a sling and a stone, and later became the King of Israel! So King David's great grandma and grandpa were Ruth and Boaz. They would have been proud to know that their great grandson would be God's chosen king!

Their journey started in the city of Gilgal, where Elijah told Elisha to tarry, or wait, because the Lord had sent him to the city of Bethal.







We walruses are very smart. When we live at a zoo we have extra time to learn all kinds of tricks, even playing the saxophone!


