CLASS NAME: COASTERS

Start class with a word of prayer.

SCRIPTURE

COASTERS TUTORIAL

MATERIALS NEEDED:

assorted wood
wood glue
finish (ex: mineral oil)

TOOLS NEEDED:

safety glasses
clamps
measuring tape
pencil
sand paper
bandsaw
table saw
pin nail gun
drill press
3 1/2" hole saw bit

*Parental assistance recommended for students under 16 years old.



SQUARE COASTERS

1.

Cut 8 pieces
18" long x 1/2"
wide x 5/8" thick.

2.

Glue and clamp all 8 pieces
of wood together.

3.

Let the glue
dry and then
scrape off
the excess.

4.

Plane the
piece to
1/2" thick.

5.

Mark and cut
4 coasters
at 4" long
apiece from
the plank.

6.

Sand and finish
each coaster.

ROUND COASTERS

1.

Repeat steps 1-4 on the square coasters to make a 4" by 8" laminated piece. Optional: could do a solid piece of wood instead.



2.

Use a 3 1/2" hole saw bit to drill out the coasters.



3.

Sand and finish each coaster.



COASTER HOLDER

1.

Cut 5 pieces
at 2" wide x
5/16" thick x:
1.) 4 1/4" long
2.) 4 3/4" long
3.) 5 1/4" long
4.) 5 3/4" long
5.) 6 1/4" long

2.

Cut 4 pieces
at 2" wide x
1/2" thick x:
1.) 1 3/4" long
2.) 2 1/4" long
3.) 2 3/4" long
4.) 3 1/4" long

Glue and clamp pieces
together starting with
5/16" piece and
placing a 1/2" piece
in-between until
there are no
more pieces.

3.

Glue from the
largest to
smallest pieces.
The order they
should go in
from bottom to
top:

6 1/4", 3 1/4",
5 3/4", 2 3/4", 5
1/4", 2 1/4", 4 3/4",
1 3/4", 4 1/4"

4.

Let the glue
dry and then
scrape off
the excess.

5.

Cut the ends off at a
33 degree angle.



6. Trace your desired curve for the backside.



7. Cut out the curve on the bandsaw.



8. Sand it down.



9. Apply finish.
