# Prayer Cloth Apron Tutorial

## Fabric

Reversible apron: two pieces 24"x20"

Apron straps: two 4" widths\* of fabric

Press play pocket: enough for two 6.5" triangles

Interfacing: enough for one 5.5" triangle

\*A "width" is when you fold your fabric in half matching the selvage edges together. Cut from the selvage edge to the folded edge making sure the strap is 4 inches wide.

PATTERN PIECES:




1.




Cut out two triangles, each side 6.5" long, for the press pocket.

2.



Cut out 1 smaller triangle of interfacing and iron it to the wrongside of one of the pocket pieces.

3.




With right sides facing, pin both triangle pieces together and sew with edge of presser foot around pocket leaving a 2" opening for prayer cloth.

4.



Clip off the corners.

5.



Turn right side out and press flat.


6.



Place prayer cloth inside 2" opening.



7.



Applique cross to the pocket with the zig zag stitch.

8.



Close the top of press play pocket by topstitching close to the edge.

9.



Round the corners of your apron. Fold the two apron pieces in half widthwise and stack them on top of each other, carefully lining up the edges. Place corner template in bottom corner and trim to round the edges.

10.




Measure 5" down from the waist on left side of the apron and place your press play pocket.

11.



Space the pocket 3" from the left side of apron. Pin in place.

12.



Sew press play pocket to apron on two sides leaving the top of pocket open.



13.



With the apron pieces right sides together, sew along the sides and bottom of the apron. Use a  $\frac{1}{2}$  seam. Do not sew along the top of the apron.

14.



Clip around the corners (only clip inside the seam allowance) and iron the seams flat. Turn apron piece right side out.

15.



Do a basting stitch across the top of apron. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the waist edge using edge of presser foot as a guide. Sew a second line  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the edge. Pull gently on the two threads to gather waist to 19" wide.

16.



Make one long apron strap by sewing your two strap pieces together (right sides facing) with a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam.

17.




Iron the waist strap in half lengthwise with right sides together.



## Next, the apron straps

18.



From the left end measure over 19 inches and place a pin. From the center seam (where you sewed the strap pieces together), measure 19" to the right and place a pin. Cut and sew as shown above.

19.



Use a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch seam when sewing the apron strap.

20.



Place a ruler on the ends of the apron strap and draw a slanted line.

21.



Sew along the lines you drew, then cut off the corners.

22.



Turn straps right side out through the opening in the middle (you can use the eraser end of pencil to turn the straps.)



23.



Inside the opening of the waist strap, fold the fabric up a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch on both sides and press in place.

24.



Place the apron piece in the open side of strap. Line up the center seam on the strap with a corner of your apron.

25.



Pin strap in place. Sew strap and apron front together. Use your presser foot to line up and stay as close to the edge as you can.
