WOODSHOP CUBE-IN-A-CUBE

AGE: 10-11

ESTIMATED LENGTH: 3 HOURS

NEEDED MATERIALS:

- 3 ½ inch by 3 ½ inch piece of hard wood

TOOLS NEEDED:

- Sander
- Drill press
- Drill bit 2 1/8" forstner bit

INTRO AND CLASS SUMMARY:

- Read Scripture and discuss parable.
- Start class with prayer.
- Play and discuss quote used from the Jubilee tape during break.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Thessalonians 5:23

And the Very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.



CUBE IN A CUBE TUTORIAL:


1. Cut block of wood 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
2. Mark center on one side of block.



3. Drill in about a 1/8" with 2 1/8" forstner bit



4. Draw a line across block where center lines intersect with drilled area



5. Set depth of drill press about 1/32 above the line just drawn




6. Drill all 6 sides starting with the engrain first



7. Now lower the drill bit slowly until there is just a little piece of wood holding the corners of the inside cube.



8. Sand the "cube"



9. Now cut the cube loose (using a sharp knife or chisel)
