

FABRIC

IF YOUR FABRIC IS 60" WIDE GET 1 5/8" YD

IF YOUR FABRIC IS 44" GET 2.5" YD




Place and cut your pattern pieces




1. Fold your fabric in half width wise. It should be a rectangle. Place your Front pattern piece on top as shown. Line up the grain line on your pattern piece with the straight grain of the fabric. This is done by keeping an equal distance from the grain line to the selvage from top to bottom of the pattern piece. Pin it in place.



2. Place your Back pattern piece against the folded edge of your fabric and pin it in place. Your pattern will tell you which edge to place against the fold.



3. Follow the directions from page 13 to make your own Camp Pocket pattern. Pin it on the fold of your fabric as shown above.



4. Cut out your front pattern pieces. Be SURE to cut out the press play notches. Because your fabric is folded in half, when you are finished cutting you will have two front pattern pieces.



5. Cut out your back pattern piece and unfold it. Be sure to cut out the press play notches.



6. Cut out your pocket piece and unfold it.




7. With Fabric right sides facing together pin your two front pieces together down their center edges. (The edges that do not have press play notches) Sew down the center with a $5/8$ " seam allowance.



9. Fold the slanted edges of your pocket piece over 1 inch to the right side of your fabric as shown and press.



8. Press your seam to the left. (This is important for your topstitching later) Serge the seam after you press it.



10. Fold raw edge back over $1/4$ inch to the wrong side of fabric to form a facing. Press and pin to hold in place.



11. A 1/2 inch from the edges, stitch across the top, down the straight sides, and across the bottom of your pocket as shown in the picture. Make sure you leave the 1/4 inch fold turned up even when you sew over it.



13. On the wrong side of the fabric, topstitch along the inner edges of the slanted sides. Move over a 1/4" and do a second row of topstitching along the slant.




12. Turn the pocket over so the wrong side of the fabric is facing you. Fold the angled edges over about a 1/2" to the wrong side of the fabric. It is important for the finished look of the pocket that your angled edges are folded over the same distance, when pinned. Tuck the points of the slanted sides under. Press and pin in place.



14. Fold your pocket piece in half widthwise and press to form a crease down the middle.




15. Measure 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " down from the top of your skirt. Place the top edge of your pocket there. Line up the crease on your pocket with the center seam of your skirt. Make sure the distance between the pocket and the skirt edges is the same on both sides. Fold your pocket's bottom edge under when you place it.



17. Topstitch the edge of your pocket. Next, a $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch below that stitchline, topstitch across the pocket again.



16. Pin your top edge and center edge in place.



(Remember that seam you pressed to the left from step 13? You should be catching the edge of that seam as you topstitch down the skirt)

18. Now, topstitch twice down the center of your skirt. First, move your needle over to the right and stitch down the center (Follow the crease you pressed in step 13). Return your needle to the center position and, a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch away from your last stitchline, topstitch down the front of the skirt again.



19. Pin the sides of your pocket in place as shown. Topstitch along the outer edge of your pocket, then move in a 1/4 inch and topstitch around the pocket again.



20. Serge the side edges of your front and back pieces.




21. Pin the front and back right sides together. Use the press play notches to match up the sides.



22. When your skirt is pinned together, on one side of the skirt place a pin 1 inch up from the bottom edge of the skirt. Place another pin 3/4 of an inch above the first pin. Do not sew the space between these two pins. Leave it open for step 29.



23. Sew your skirt sides together using a $\frac{5}{8}$ " seam allowance. Press both of your side seams open after sewing. Remember to not sew $\frac{3}{4}$ " opening in the left side seam. Backtrack wherever you start or stop on the side seams.



24. Turn your skirt right side out. Topstitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away on both sides of your side seams.



25. Turn your skirt inside out and serge the top (waist) and bottom (hem) edges of your skirt.



26. Make your waistband casing by folding down the top edge of your skirt $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press and pin in place. Stitch around the waist staying close to the serged edge, and leave a 1" opening for threading your waist elastic in a later step.




27. Turn your skirt right side out and edgestitch along the upper edge of your waistband. You do not need to leave an opening on the top edge.




29. Overlap the elastic 1/2 inch, and use a zig-zag stitch to sew the ends together. Stich the 1" opening in the waistband shut.



28. Take your 1" elastic and attach one end to your safety pin. Insert the safety pin into the opening and pull it through the waistband and out the other side of the opening.



When your hem is folded up and sewn in place, this is how the opening you made in step 19 will look.



30. For your hem, Fold up the bottom edge of your skirt up 1". Press and pin it in place. Sew around the hem staying close to the serged edge. Turn your skirt right side out and topstitch along the folded (or bottom) edge of the hem.



31. Thread your elastic cording through your drawstring threader. Insert the threader through the opening in your hem, and pull it through the other side.



33. Place the cord stop. Pull a loop through your cord stop



32. Remove the drawstring threader and tie a knot in the elastic cording and cut off the excess. pull on the elastic to hide the knot inside the hem casing and sew one stitch to hold the knot in place

"CAMP POCKET" PATTERN

You will need
Roll of butcher paper
or large sheet of paper.

Pencil

Ruler

Scissors

1. Decide how long and how wide you want your camp pocket to be. Add a half inch to the width and length you chose.

(For example, if you were making a 6 inch wide by 9.5 inch long pocket your measurements would be 6.5 by 10" You can choose your own custom pocket size or use the pocket measurements Creations used. The Creations' pocket sizes have already accounted for the extra half inch.

Pocket Size Chart


XS- 6.5x 10

S- 7 1/2"x 10"


M- 8.25x

L- 9.5x 10


XL- 10.5"x10"




2. Draw a rectangle that is as wide and as long as your measurements.




3. On the left side of the rectangle place your ruler so it measures the same distance between the two intersecting lines is the same as your width measurement. Draw the line.




4. Find the center of that line and draw a one inch line straight up from that point.



5. At the top of that 1 inch line, center your ruler and draw a line that is 2 inches longer than your width measurement



6. Connect the ends of your slanted lines.



7. Cut out your pattern piece as shown, and your "Camp Pocket" pattern is ready to use!
