CLASS NAME:



- •Today we're going to talk about what Jesus did for us 2,000 years ago and what that does for us today. What it means to us. Can anybody tell me what Jesus did for us? He died on the cross for our sins

He died for you and for me. Back in the old testament they sacrificed a lamb to show they were sorry for those things that they did wrong. But they still had the same desires. Then one day Jesus came and took our sins to that old rugged cross. He didn't even do anything wrong but He willingly suffered for you and me because He loved us all SO much. There on that cross Jesus shed His blood for us. His Blood began to drip and flow from the cross. FLANNEL BOARD Blood coming from cross

Oh He really loves us!

And because of what He did for us, we no longer have to sacrifice 'A' lamb, because 'THE' Lamb came and took not only our sins but also the desire for those sins away. When we tell Jesus we are sorry for our sins and accept Him in our hearts, He sees us through His shed blood. Our sins are all washed away and Jesus set us free!

•Ask the children questions on quote.

Is there anything we can do to be good enough? No

Jesus sees us through what? His Blood.

Does He see our red sins anymore? No

Why can He not see them? Because His Blood made them white as snow.

• But there are times we make mistakes. How many have done something wrong and you felt so bad about it? You might have felt kind of down, sad or lonely. Teacher raise hand with children.

That was Jesus speaking to your hearts in That still, small Voice. When you went and told Mommy, Daddy or whoever it was that you were sorry, then how did you feel? Children express their feelings of relief, being so happy, love of Jesus in their hearts, Mommy and Daddy being proud of them.

• Yes, you felt SO much better now because you kicked the devil away and made Jesus welcome and happy! You have no condemnation in your heart! You're good little boys and girls and don't want to do those things. Jesus was our Example and we all want to be like Him don't we?. Guess what? When you make that mistake and ask forgiveness, telling Jesus you're sorry, He doesn't even see it! So you can put your name under That crimson Flow, His Blood. Why does He not see your sin? because He sees us through His shed blood! Yes, and you can say it's JUST as IF I'D never sinned!! Let's all say that together.

Everyone say together "It's just as if I'd never sinned!" Remember how Bro. Joseph has been encouraging us. Yes, we are going to fail and make mistakes, but we're JUSTIFIED. Let's hear our prophet tell us about it.

- •Let's turn in our Bibles to Romans 8:1 and read what Paul said Scripture Reading (Maybe have children repeat after teacher in scripture reading)
- •"There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."
- •When we have Jesus in our hearts we don't want to do those things of the flesh (teacher demonstrating, pointing to our flesh / body) but of the Spirit, we want to do those things that please the Holy Spirit. What are some of the things that please Him? Quiet Time (reading Bible, praying, listening to Tape), listening to Daddy and Mommy, being sweet to brother, sister, friends, talking about Jesus, witnessing for Him, etc.

• That's right. When we come under the Blood, receiving the Token, our desires are for the things that are pleasing to Him, our heavenly Father. Jesus gave His life for us and we want to live our lives for Him.



Scripture:

There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

Romans 8:1

Quote 1:

"Now, look. You take the scientific research. And you take red, a piece of red goods or a red piece of stuff, cellophane, and look through at a piece of red, and red through red looks white. Try it. Take red and look through red; it looks white.

We can't. We can forgive but not forget. I could forgive you, but I always remember you done these evil things. Then, you're not just; you're forgiven.







Flannel Graph



MATERIALS NEEDED:

- 9"x12" foam board,
- ruler, scissors
- 16"x12" wide aluminum foil
- masking tape
- hot glue gun
- double sided tape

- twine
- two sticks
- red cellophane
- quote
- Justified label
- pattern





STEPS:

- 1. Cut piece of aluminum foil 16" long
- 2. Cut several pieces of masking tape 16" and cover foil completely.
- 3. Fold foil in half so it is now 8" long
- 4. Pinch sides together on open end of fold
- 5. Open up at top along closed end of fold
- 6. Bring each side down
- 7. Begin pressing and gently scrunching to form valleys and peaks for mountain
- 8. Hot glue mountain to corner of 9" x 12" foam board
- 9. Very carefully make small hole in backside of mountain. (Be sure to keep the hole small because you can always make it a little bit bigger if needed)
- 10. Cut 2 sticks, one to 9", the other to 4". About 2" from top of longest stick, hot glue 2 sticks where they come together for cross
- 11. Wrap with twine where they form the cross and hot glue in place.
- 12. Place a little bit of hot glue on bottom of cross
- 13. Carefully place in hole at back. Press and hold to secure to the bottom
- 14. Cut 2 pieces of red cellophane to pattern
- 15. Secure pieces together with double sided tape
- 16. Put a strip of hot glue coming down the mountain from the cross
- 17. Let glue just cool a little and gently press the cellophane to glue it down
- 18. Cut pieces of packaging tape, fold in half and cut into about 1" strips. In red, write different sins children can relate to
- 19. Under the cellophane use a glue stick and glue the sins to the foam board.
- 20. Glue quote and JUSTIFIED label to board
- Praise God, my sins are gone!
- 22. Write your name above the JUSTIFIED logo
- 21. Put command strips on the back of your project to hang it on the wall
- 21. You're done!
