

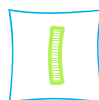

At Creations Class

Our young people were once again excited to see what was in store for them at Creations. A word of prayer was offered unto our Lord Jesus to start off the class. It was then time to transition into the lesson for the day, "Cleaning Up!"

Brother Branham would be teaching the children about the process a Christian must go through to be put into the service of the Lord. After the quote was played, the children were asked to list the three stages.

Those stages were then written on the board: justification, sanctification, and the baptism of the Holy Ghost. Then the teacher demonstrated the process of the dirty jar, as instructed by Brother Branham.

Lastly, as the teacher filled the jar, everyone joined in singing, "Jesus Love Is A Bubbling Over..." How do we stay bubbling over for the Lord so that we can be "in service"? Many hands were up in the air with answers following:

"Quiet Time, read our Bible, listen to tapes, obey God."

Finally, it was their turn to go through the steps Brother Branham outlined in the parable of the jar. They equipped themselves with aprons and gloves, ready to find their jars that were buried in the troughs. Their next stop was to wash their jars. At each station the students were reminded of the stage that it represented, "picking up the jar, justification..."

Lastly, these jars would be put in service as a planter! The students were allowed to be creative and select seven layers of colored rocks, soil, moss, wood shavings, and colored sand. After planting the succulent, a tag with the quote was attached to remind them of the lesson for that day.

The children then left with their jars, excited to tell their parents the three stages a Christian goes through.

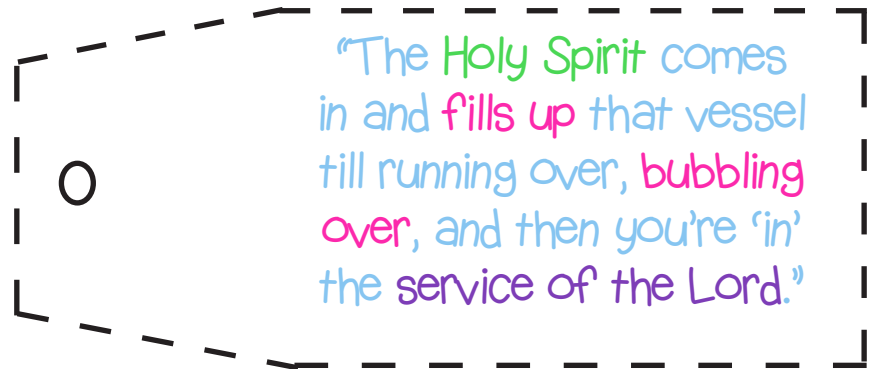
1. Justification

3. Baptism of the Holy Spirit
 - Fills up that sanctified vessel
 - Fills the glass till it's bubbling over

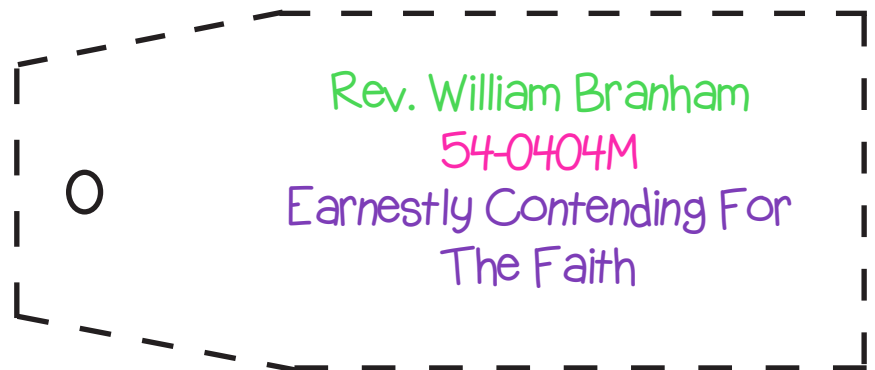
