CLASS NAME: **Labyrinth**

Labyrinth

TUTORIAL

MATERIALS NEEDED:

assorted wood
wood glue
finish (ex: mineral oil)
3/8" diameter marble or bearing

TOOLS NEEDED:

safety glasses
measuring tape
pencil
clamps
sand paper
table saw
drill press
pin nail gun
1/2" forstner bit
coping saw

CUT LIST:

Base: 1 piece 4 1/4" wide x 6 7/8" long x 3/4" thick

Smaller side border: 2 pieces 3/8" wide x 3 1/2" long x 3/8" thick

Larger side border: 2 pieces 3/8" wide x 6 7/8" long x 3/8" thick

Maze pieces: various strips 3/16" wide x desired length x 3/8" thick

*Parental assistance recommended.



1.

Trace/draw a design of the labyrinth onto the base. You can use the design we have in this tutorial or create your own.

2.

Glue and pin nail the border pieces around the base.

3.

Measure, cut, glue, and pin nail the maze pieces on the lines of your design.

4.

Use a 1/2" forstner bit to drill out the trap holes for your maze. Be careful not to drill through the base.

5.

Sand the entire project and apply finish.
