CLASS NAME: NOAH'S ARK

Project: Noah and the ark scene

Scripture:

I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth.

Genesis 9:13

Activity:

Get a "three cornered glass" and reflect light off of it to create a rainbow. Brother Branham talks about this



prism on tape. The three sides are one like the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. It creates the seven colors of the rainbow, which is the seven Spirits of God.

Read about the story of Noah in Cub Corner magazine issue 1 pages 14-15 and issue 23 pages 16-17.

Lesson:

- o We should be like Noah:
 - Stay obedient to the Word of God.
 - Be patient. Noah waited 120 years because he knew God always kept His promises.
 - Never doubt God's Word, no matter how things look or what others may say.
 - "No matter how bad it seems like, and how dark it gets, still believe your absolute." Brother Branham 63-0304
 - Don't fear.
 - Noah did not fear, because God promised to save him and his family. Noah trusted the ark because the ark was what God provided for his salvation.
- o God's rainbow covenant.
 - God promised to never destroy the earth by water again.
 - He set the rainbow in the sky as a token. Explain a token.
 - "God the great Master rainbow in the skies (we'd say like that with the seven Spirits of God: red, perfect love. " Brother Branham 58-0619B
- o A rainbow has seven perfect colors.
 - Talk about the colors and what some of them mean
 - Red: love
 - Blue: fellowship and trueness
 - Green: life
 - Amber (yellowish green): the color of God
 - Talk about the number seven being perfection.
 - God is perfect in seven.
 - Seven church ages, seven seals, seven messengers, seven Spirits of God, etc.

Quote:

“Noah had patience. Yeah. Noah had real, godly patience. God said, “I’m going to destroy this world with rain,” and Noah preached a hundred and twenty years, yet. Plenty of patience. Not even dew fell from Heaven. Wasn’t nothing. Just as dusty as it ever was, for a hundred and twenty years, but he was patient. Then, God tries your patience. That’s right. God tries them.

After He told Noah, now He said, “Noah, I want you to go ahead and get in the ark. I’m going to run the animals in there, and I--I want you get in. Climb way upstairs, now, so you can look out, top window. Now, I want you get in there. I want you to tell these people, ‘Tomorrow, what I been preaching for a hundred and twenty years, is going to take place.’ All right, you go down there and tell them.”

What was the first sign? Noah got in the ark. Wasn’t no rain. Noah got ready, and got the raincoat on, and everything, so he could look out, once in a while. Got ready. But the next day...

I believe he might have told his family, and his daughter-in-laws and all them, said, “Oh, my! Tomorrow you’re going to see something you ain’t never seen. Because, all over the skies, they’re going to be black. And thunder and lightning is going to take place. God’s big sword is going to zip through the sky. He’s going to condemn these bunch of sinners that’s turned us down, for this hundred and twenty years. You just watch and see.” See?

Some of the half-way believers, you know, that hang around and don’t ever come in, you know. You--you still have them, you know. So they--they come up, said, “Well, the old man might have been right, so we’ll go up and wait a few days, or wait a few hours in the morning, and see.”

Next day, instead of a black cloud, here come the sun coming up just like it always did. Noah looked out. Said, “Hey, there ain’t no cloud.”

That guy come up, said, “Ah, I knowed you was one of them. You see, you’re hanging around up here.”

“Well, pardon me, sir. Ha-ha. Maybe I--I--I just, you know, just enthused, you know. Kind of, see. Ha-ha-ha.”

But, Noah, he had patience. Said, “If it didn’t come today, it’ll be here tomorrow.” Why? God said so.

“When did He tell you that, Noah?”

“A hundred and twenty years ago. I’ve come this far, so I’m just waiting here now.” See that? After a while...

We find, God come this far, waiting for the Church, too, but It’ll be there. Don’t you worry. He promised It.

And the people are laughing, and throwing rotten tomatoes and things against the side of it. Look there what you’re doing. Why, you know...”

“Be patient, son.”

“Are you sure?”

“It will rain!”

His daughter-in-law said, “Father, you know...”

“It will rain!”

“But we’ve been all these years, waiting. We been preparing. And you told us it’s going to rain, a week ago. And we’re in here, and the doors are all shut, and here we are walking around in here, and the sun just scorching right down like it was.”

“How do you know?”


“God said so!”

MATERIALS NEEDED:




1.

Glue the blue construction paper over the chipboard.



Punch holes at the top of the paper for the rainbow, three inches from each side.

2.



Lay out the popsicle sticks in this order to create the ark. Glue them down.

Put the pipe cleaners through the holes, matching the color order of the rainbow. Bend them to secure.

5.



Glue cotton balls over the pipe cleaners to create clouds.

6.



Glue the animals, dove, and hero card onto the scene.
