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## **CRAFT BOXCAR CLASS**

AGE: 4-6

ESTIMATED LENGTH: 3 HOURS

### **NEEDED MATERIALS:**

#### **Student Materials Needed:**

- Milk carton
- 4 bottle caps
- 6 regular size popsicle sticks
- 7 large popsicle sticks
- Red construction paper
- Poster board measuring 5 1/2"x9"
- Glue stick-for boxcar
- Elmer's glue- for track
- Scissors
- Black crayon
- Seal sticker
- 3-5 Tapes
- Materials that need pre-cut:
  - Red construction paper 7 3/4"x4" (4 each)
  - Red construction paper squares 4"x4" (1 each)
  - Red construction paper 2"x4" (2 each)
- Pre- cut regular size popsicle sticks 3 1/2" used for teachers to glue onto doors of cart (2 each)

#### **Teacher's Supplies:**

- Scissors
- Hot glue gun

### **INTRO AND CLASS SUMMARY:**

1. Gather Students And Begin In Prayer.
2. Read And Discuss Quotes: Moral parable - Sealed by the Holy Spirit

You take a boxcar, they'll start loading it, and loading it, on the track. Many of you people here, I know some of you that loads cars. And they'll go around; they'll call for so much here and so much there. But before that car can be sealed, the inspector has to come along. He looks through and he sees that everything's in there is tight, and everything's ready. It's going to its destination. Well, if there's anything loose, and afraid it'll break, he will say, "Take her out; fix her over again until you get it." And when it's altogether tightened and packed and set down, then he will slam the doors and seal it, and no one can break that seal until it goes to its destination. That right?

That's the way it is where it says of Ephesians 4:30, "Grieve not the Holy Spirit of God whereby you're sealed until the day of your redemption." Got some loose rattles, God will take it out of you and--and fix it up before you're sealed into the Kingdom.

Every man in here, and every woman, without the baptism of the Holy Ghost; the only reason you haven't got it, because you believe not. That's right. The belief... We've took it this week and proved it that Abraham believed God, by faith. That's right.

**Class Summary:**

This class teaches the importance of being sealed by the Holy Spirit, creating a sealed boxcar based off the story Brother Branham tells.

-Go over basic guidelines/rules.

-Show examples/samples and demonstrate.

-Let students begin building and decorating their own boxcar.

**BUILDING THE BOXCAR:**

1. Teachers, need to open up top of milk carton (should be able to pull open by hand). You will end up with carton fully open and 4 creased pieces on opened in, you will need

to cut off the front piece of carton just down to crease (DO NOT CUT INTO ACTUAL MILK CARTON )and the back piece of carton down to crease. You will be left with 2 side pieces and remaining rectangle carton.

2. Teachers, take 2 regular size Popsicle sticks cut it to about 3 1/2", you will be hot gluing these onto the carton flaps length wise, the carton flaps will be the doors to your boxcar!

3. Kids now need to take their 4 pieces of (7 3/4"x4") red rectangle construction paper and glue to all 4 sides of the carton.

4. Kids need to glue the red 4"x4" construction paper to the bottom of their carton and then glue the 2 pieces 2"x4" of red construction paper onto the outside of the flaps.

5. Teachers, hot glue 4 bottle caps onto sides of carton, 2 on right side and 2 on left side (half the cap on the box, half cap hanging off the box) these will be the wheels!

6. Have students write their name on the bottom of their boxcar (below wheels)

7. Each child will need a piece of poster board (5 1/2"x9") and have them write their name on it.

8. Next, the kids will need Elmer's glue and the remaining popsicle sticks, have the kids place the 7 large popsicle sticks on the poster board (width) and space them out evenly (on opposite side of where they wrote their name). Then have them glue the sticks down to poster board with Elmer's glue. It should start to look like a train track!

9. Use the remaining 4 regular size popsicle sticks and place and glue (lengthwise) on the track, you may need to have them hold their boxcar over the track to determine where they need to glue the sticks.

10. Next, each child will get 3-5 Brother Branham tapes to load into their boxcar.

11. Last, each child gets a Seal sticker to close the doors of the boxcar.
